

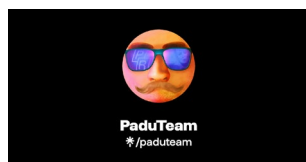

About us

La Brèche is a clearly self-identified Marxist communist organisation, bringing together three complementary media outlets engaged in political analysis, the circulation of critical ideas, and grassroots action.

Paduteam: a political-analysis YouTube channel that now has more than 100,000 subscribers and over a million views a month, offering educational and critical content on current political and economic affairs.

Positions Revue: a digital Marxist journal (soon to be available in print) offering theoretical and strategic analysis on the contemporary challenges of capitalism, labour and social struggles.

OnNeVeutPlus: a grassroots network with a nationwide reach of more than 4,000 mobilisable supporters, and a YouTube channel dedicated to interviews with activists, collectives and figures from social movements.

The organisation aims to bring together theoretical reflection, media outreach and grassroots action, with a view to social and political transformation.

Our achievements

- 3 YouTube channels, totalling over a million views a month and more than 100,000 subscribers combined
- A nationwide network of more than 4,000 mobilisable supporters
- Local groups set up across the country

- « Plus Jamais PS » (Never Again PS) campaign, running since November 2025: over 11,600 posters distributed and put up across France, from Nantes to Poitiers, Paris to Lyon, and as far as Bayonne

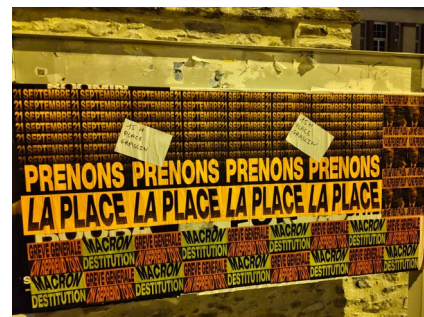

Synopsis

Sixty years after the Tricontinental Conference held in Havana in 1966, this documentary examines the legacy of an event that brought together, for the first time, liberation movements from Africa, Asia and Latin America under a single international strategy against colonialism and imperialism.

Through the analysis of sociologist and activist Saïd Bouamama, the film explores how this unique experience helped build concrete solidarity between peoples in struggle: from Vietnam to South Africa, from Palestine to Africa's liberation movements. Far more than a page of history, the Tricontinental appears as a political, cultural and intellectual laboratory whose questions still resonate with today's crises.

As the world order undergoes deep changes, Western hegemony is challenged, and new power dynamics emerge, the documentary asks a central question: are the world's peoples capable today of reinventing an international solidarity equal to the challenges of the 21st century?



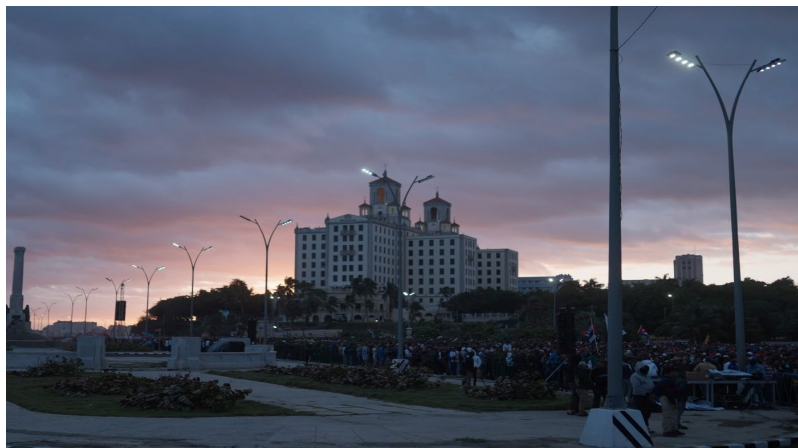
The Havana Tricontinental Conference, 1966

Director's note

In January 2026, on the occasion of the 60th anniversary of the Havana Tricontinental Conference, we accompanied sociologist and Marxist activist Saïd Bouamama to Cuba. Very quickly, this journey went beyond a simple commemorative framework: behind the memory of a major historical event of the 20th century arose a much broader question — what remains today of the internationalist spirit that animated the national liberation movements and revolutionary organisations of the last century?

Our intention was not to produce a historical film in the classic sense, but to bring two timeframes into dialogue: that of 1966, when representatives of the peoples of Africa, Asia and Latin America came together to devise a common strategy against imperialism, and that of today, where new forms of cooperation, resistance and international organising are trying to emerge in a profoundly different context.

More than a film about Cuba or the Tricontinental, this documentary is an invitation to fully commit to the anti-imperialist struggle. It speaks to everyone seeking to understand the transformations of the contemporary world and the political prospects taking shape within it.

The Nanterre screening

On 13 June, the documentary was screened in Nanterre before nearly 1,000 people, with Salim Lamrani, Saïd Bouamama and Dr Zoé present to discuss it with the audience afterwards.

A film already in demand worldwide

As of 3 July, less than a week after screening requests opened, the film has already received 150 requests from around the world: the United States, Canada, Latin America, Germany, Switzerland, Italy, Belgium, Jordan, South Korea...

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
